Vice Chair Siegel moved, seconded by Supervisor Kenning to approve a request to hire Martha Miller as a part-time temporary Clerk in the Auditor's office, hire date 9/23/2014 at an hourly rate of \$11.46. Motion carried.

Chair Parker said there are 39 applicants for the emergency management position with today being the last day to accept applications.

Vice Chair Siegel said with the Salvation Army closing, the Board is talking with a couple of agencies to keep it going in November.

Ottumwa Mayor Tom Lazio wanted to go on record as supporting the County's investing in the computer access for the Sheriff's deputy vehicles, considering it a good investment for their safety as well as future law enforcement.

Mayor Lazio also said that Vice Chair Siegel did a great job representing the County in support of the grant for the tunnel under Highway 34 for the City/County trails effort. He further recommended the County consider a \$10,000
